Coral Guardian is a French NGO that acts for the conservation of coral ecosystems and for the communities that depend on them. The NGO is distinguished by the development of concrete field-based reef restoration actions, involving local communities.

Coral Guardian's mission is to share the field-based knowledge and expertise over the years in Indonesia in a universal way thanks to a training program, the Blue Center, which is carried out in two stages. First, a training manual serves as a technical support and can reach a broad spectrum of project leaders. Second, Coral Guardian offers practical training in one of the regional training centers that puts theory into practice. This program gives rise to two types of projects:

- **core projects** (regular support at a technical, social, administrative, and financial level)
- **consultancy projects** (occasional support at a technical, social, and administrative level)

Candidates that are allowed to submit an application must:

- have a structure recognized by the local government
- respond to an environmental issue concerning coral reefs
- involve local people in the project
- have a motivated and committed project manager

Documents required:

- fully completed application form (required)
- official status of the local structure (required)
- budget of the total project (required)
- photos of the project, the team (optional)
- organization chart of the local structure (optional)
- CV of the project manager (optional)
- communication documents if available (optional)
- any other document related to the project






